Join us in warmly welcoming Hannah as she begins her ministry at RTLC!


Rainbow Heads Up To Sky Ranch! RTLC Sends Staff to Sky Ranch for Fire Recovery Projects

In dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic these past two summers, Rainbow Trail's Bridging Borders program has been heavily affected. Since safety is Rainbow Trail's priority, we have held groups back from traveling to the usual locations we have served over the years. However, Rainbow Trail was excited to head up north this summer and help our sister camp Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp! In 2020, the Cameron Peak fire burnt over 208,913 acres throughout the Arapaho-Roosevelt National Forests. While burning, the fire was on track to take out Sky Ranch's complete site. But due to God's amazing grace and the fantastic work and bravery of local Fire Fighters, Sky Ranch's site was only partially damaged and still



stands today!

This summer, Rainbow Trail sent two groups of Summer Directors to help and serve Sky Ranch in their fire recovery projects! Projects consisted of rebuilding tent platforms and food prep areas for their backpacking program, building



a new worship area, planting and watering new trees around the site, and rebuilding some trails. Rainbow Trail staff worked with volunteer groups who gave their time to help Sky Ranch, along with Sky Ranch staff who lead the groups.

The relationship between



Thank you all for giving so fully to this ministry and being flexible in sharing your knowledge and time with our staff!

I also want to thank all of our partner congregations for their support of Rainbow Trail. I know these continue to challenging financial times for all of us. Yet, so many of you have continued to give and give freely to this ministry to help sustain us. The congregations and the Rocky Mountain Synod have become the financial foundation upon which we are able to build this ministry. There are now over 85 partner congregations that contribute to this ministry. Thank you for seeing us as partners in your ministry and in the faith development of your youth and families. Thank you also to the Rocky Mountain Synod for your steady support for outdoor ministry.

As the Rainbow Trail community, you have set the bar high with respect to what it means to support and fully commit to an outdoor ministry. I am grateful for and humbled by the donors that supported in the crazy 2020 year and have continued to believe in and support us in 2021. People have been so generous toward RTLC. We are on firm footing because of you. Thank you!!

We've had a lot of transition in our full-time team during the last 12 months. Sands Simonton joined us in January and Hannah Loeffler-Kemp came onboard in late August. We are still learning how we fully complement one another as a team, but I will tell you that I love this group and see so much potential in their leadership together going forward. The coming year is going to be epic. Thanks to the full-time gang for your passion, your love of this ministry, and your friendship. Love you all!

Registration for 2022 will open on November 1st at 12:01 am. Members of the churches of the Rocky Mountain Synod, ELCA have registration priority until January 1st, 2022. After that date, it is open registration. Rumor on the street is that early registration is going to vigorous! Take advantage of this next two months of priority registration. This will ensure that your camper gets into the week of camp that they want to attend. If you wait until even late January, many camps will be full and your choices will be limited. Because of what we experienced this past summer, our plan is to go forward with camp as we did this summer unless conditions change that would warrant not gathering.

The land exchange process is still moving forward! The often revised but now final version of our feasibility analysis is at the regional supervisor's office for final review. The West Coast wildfires this summer once again hampered our progress as many forest service employees were called out to battle the fires. We are still hoping for an affirmative result sometime this fall and that we will sign the Agreement to Initiate the actual land exchange before the end of the year. Keep this process in your prayers. We will keep you informed as things progress. We do need to raise about \$120,000 to complete this whole process if you are interested in helping us finish this project.

If you haven't heard, Brad Abbott is retiring as the Executive Director of Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp effective sometime later this fall. Brad has been an awesome partner in ministry as we have done outdoor ministry together in this Synod for over 11 years. Brad has loved planning and leading worship, has brought great programmatic and financial leadership to Sky Ranch, and was always a helpful resource for RTLC as we both managed two summers in a pandemic. I ask you to join me in thanking Brad for his incredible years of service to the church through outdoor ministries. Please join our Board and full-time staff in keeping Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp in your prayers as they begin the search process to find Brad's replacement. Brad, it has been a great ride together. Congratulations as you begin this new chapter in your life. Know that you have made a difference in the lives of literally thousands of campers and staff members. Enjoy retirement – know you will be missed!

Nell and I have been to four weddings this fall, all of them involving at least one staff member. There have been a lot of other camp people that have attended those weddings as well. It has been a great reminder for me of the incredible community that I have the privilege to be a part of through this special place. I have been blessed to serve you. Paniel, You Will Be Missed!



After 3 years of full time work with Rainbow Trail, Daniel has moved on to serve our ministry in a new way at the ELCA Churchwide office as the Director of Young Adult Ministries. And as excited as we are for the gifts he will bring to Churchwide, we will miss him dearly! Daniel first joined Rainbow Trail from Wisconsin as a Program Assistant and how lucky we have been to keep him on staff in the role of Director of Retreating for the 2 years following.

In all the ways Daniel has served Rainbow Trail, he left a tangible impact on both culture and programming. Pastor Nicole said it best when asked about Daniels impact. She said: "Daniel's deep spirituality, his joy, and his desire to include everyone were incredible gifts to RTLC. And then Daniel has the gift of hospitality like few people I have encountered in my life and in my ministry. Well, I just finished the Women's retreat. What fun! I look forward to this retreat every year! First, I want to say Missie Bonser is awesome! Every year the ladies on Sunday will say over and over how they can't believe they feel so renewed and connected in such a short time. Thank you, Missie, for bringing such joy to the hearts of so

Our retreat season has been very busy! First, I was honored to be a part of Kyle and Katie's wedding! Second, we have had groups here every weekend since Labor Day, and I love it!

The valley is full of beautiful colors. It just

makes my heart smile to see the brilliant gold's and red's showing in the burn scars. God is regrowing our mountain!

I have been asked once again to provide the Banana Cookie recipe, so

3/4c. Softened butter, 3/4c. Firmly packed brown sugar, 2 medium ripe bananas, mashed, 1 large egg, ½ tsp. Vanilla extract, 2c. Flour (feel free to substitute 1:1 gluten-free flour) 1/2tsp. Baking powder, □ tsp. Baking soda, ¼ tsp. Salt. Heat oven to 350. Beat butter and brown sugar till creamy. Add bananas, egg, and vanilla sugar till creamy.

nilla. Beat till mixed well. Add flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt; beat at low speed till mixed well. Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls 2 inches apart onto ungreased cookie sheets. Bake, 8 - 10 minutes or till edges are lightly browned.

While the cookies are baking, melt 2 Tbl. butter in a 1-quart saucepan over medium heat. Add 3 Tbl. brown sugar and 2 Tbl. half and half. Continue cooking, occasionally stirring, till the mixture comes to a boil. Cook for one minute; remove from heat. Add 1 ¼ c. powdered sugar and ½ tsp. Vanilla extract; beat well. Spoon warm frosting onto warm cookies. If you can wait for frosting beat well. Spoon warm frosting onto warm cookies. If you can wait for frosting to set and enjoy! I think you should always make a double batch!

If you have any of the recipes from previous newsletters, you should know that you can make any of my recipes with a good gluten-free flour and a milk substitute if that is your dietary need. Except for the bread recipe!

Sometimes in my kitchen, I need to figure out a way to do something quicker and easier. This happened a couple of times recently. First, I had to find an easy way to skin garlic cloves. I have a silicone tube at home that I use, but I don't have one at work! So, looking around the kitchen, I spied the silicone hot pads that I purchased at the Dollar Tree. These have raised patterns on them. I took one, folded it in half, put 8 garlic cloves in the fold, and rolled it back and forth 3-4 times. Amazing! It worked better than my tube at home, and the clean-up was so easy! The next one was trying to find something to use to push puff pastry into muffin tins without ripping it. Guess what?!! The bulb on your turkey baster is just the right size! Who knew!?

Now for some strange but true food facts. Potatoes can absorb and reflect Wi-Fi signals. Fruit gummies are coated with the most complex natural wax known to man; Carnuba. It's the same type of wax used to coat cars! Black pepper, which is readily available in stores, was once considered a luxury item. During the Middle Ages, it was worth its weight in gold since gold and silver were easy enough to come by, but pepper wasn't. I love this one! The Aztecs once used chocolate as currency to pay taxes! Cheese is the most shoplifted food item in the world. The number of Hot Dogs eaten on the 4th of July would stretch from Weshington DC to LA five times over! from Washington DC to LA five times over!

Hanging With Hannah

Transitions allow space for adaptation, reflection, creativity, and innovation. In this time of transition between seasons, between full time staff, and between navigating a camp during a pandemic, we find ourselves continuing to create space for radical ministry to happen.
