#### RTLC moves into the final stages of the land exchange

In 1998, the Rainbow Trail Board of Directors first approached the U.S. Forest Service about doing a land exchange to own our site. At that time, the Forest Service was not even interested in exploring the exchange. Roll forward twenty-five years, and we are now on the verge of completing this exchange and owning our site becoming a reality!

It has been an amazing journey to bring us to this point: from cottage meetings in the backyards of our supporters sharing the "why's" of the land exchange, to raising over \$600,000 in 2012 that would allow us to pay cash, in 2014, for the land we will use in the land exchange, to submitting our official land exchange proposal to the Forest Service in

2018, to where we sit today. We are deep in the land exchange process now. The conservation easement is now in legal review with Colorado Open Lands. The required environmental and cultural resources field studies are all happening as we speak. The US Forest Service is beginning to

review the draft field reports from ERO Resources Corporation and Rare Earth Sciences, and we are starting to see the end in sight. The reality is that this has been a very long process and it was inevitable that the cost of completing the exchange would increase. However, we were very surprised

that the costs of the process that we based all of our fundraising estimates on in May of 2022 has increased by almost \$100,000 by November of 2023. Those increases include a new rare species study that is now required and will cost \$45,000, and can only take place in the months of May and June in 2024. This has pushed our closing date into late spring 2025.

So we need your help to TAKE US HOME! We have worked together for so many years to get us to this point. Let's finish this process! We need to raise the remaining \$93,100 to cover the new studies and cost increases from the shear number of years we've been in this process. We continue to ask for your prayers and your financial support for this **CONT. PAGE 2**



Between a Board meeting, the Bible Study Writers' retreat, Colorado recruiting, the winter newsletter, and sneaking in four promotion Sundays at several churches before we leave for the mid-west, we have been going fast. I love the beginning of a new year. We are fresh back from a break, the air is full of optimism, and we are so ready to get things going!!

We have had incredible registrations for our summer on-site programs. Five weeks are already full with three more



getting close to full. We have over 980 campers already registered for this summer and it is still early. Don't wait to register! Take a look at which week will work for your child and register now. It will be a life-changing week for your kids! We also have 29 day camps scheduled that will be happening out in the congregations. There is still room for your senior high youth to go on a Compass Points backpacking trip or Bridging Borders service trip this summer. Many people think that church camp is a nice "add-on" in their child's summer. But a week at camp can be both life-changing and faith transforming. I hear from campers over and over again about how camp has solidified their faith and really equipped them to be Christ's light in the world. Camp changes people in some amazing ways. I want every child to experience this wonderfully loving and grace-filled community. Money should never be the reason any child doesn't come to RTLC. So, don't let that be a barrier. The first question to ask is "Do you want your child to go to camp?" That is a yes/no question. If your answer is yes, then, together, let's figure out a way to get them there. If you are in a position where finances will prevent you from sending your child to camp, please contact me—we'll find a way to get your child to camp! We have very generous donors that have given specifically to provide camperships for this exact reason. Do this for your child. We'd love to see you on the mountain!

The field work for the land exchange is in full swing with much of the final key work happening this coming summer and early fall. This includes rare species studies as well as appraisals of both properties. As the lead article says, the extended time line as well as a new and additional rare species study costing \$45,000 has put us in a position to need to raise some final funds to complete this project. Please continue to keep this Land Exchange in your prayers. Help Take Us Home!

I am humbled by the support that this community has shown this ministry. 2023 was another phenomenal year of ministry, and the financial gifts that we received from all you have set us up for a quick start in 2024. Colorado Gives Day was beyond anything we could have imagined. Thank you from the bottom of my heart. I will say there is no greater return on your investment than a gift to this ministry that is used to shape the faith life of a child. Kids are experiencing God's love in a huge and tremendous way. I truly do believe these experiences are life-changing. Campers leave camp changed to live God's love and grace in the world. Can you ask for more than that?

We started our recruiting for summer staff in late January. We did a small loop through the Colorado schools during the week of January 21st and then we'll head to the mid-west on February 5th. I am optimistic about this year. We already have over 55 summer staff applications either completed or in process. Recruiting is back to our normal process including our west coast tour to Pacific Lutheran University in the northwest and maybe to Grand Canyon University in Phoenix.

Nell and I are loving our new home. We have settled in fairly quickly. We love being closer to our kids and all that a larger city has to offer. This spring will still include emptying lots of boxes from the garage and getting my shop set up. Anyone that knows me knows I love taking care of my yard. We have bought a real challenge in that respect. It will be fun to see how things in the yard transform as we come out of winter!

I am so excited for the coming year. Our camper numbers are better than pre-pandemic times (2019) and we have very full summer camps, the land exchange field work is in full swing and we should be close to completion by May of 2025, we have an awesome and complete full-time ministry team in place, we have a strong and visionary Board, and there is an air of optimism about the future. Please pray for this ministry and for our staff. We take great joy in serving you through RTLC. I am beginning my 36th year at Rainbow Trail. I could not have asked for a better place to serve and use all of my gifts. The RTLC community is our family. You have all become an integral part of our story. Thanks for being my partner all along the way! I am so excited for 2024!



#### Qualified Charitable Distributions and **Donor Advised Funds: Great Additional Ways** To Support RTLC

The support from our donors is key to our ministry thriving and growing. There are a multitude of ways that you can give to this ministry. Stocks, bonds, mutual and ETF funds, checks, online, and gifts to annual support or specific projects like the land exchange or camperships are just a few. However, there are some other tools available of which you may not be aware.

If you own an IRA and are over the age 70 1/2 you may be eligible to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (ie. a contribution to RTLC) directly from your IRA and not include the amount given as subject to income tax. And such charitable gifts reduce the amount of Required Minimum Distribution you must take for yourself every year! Because of recent law changes, it is always good to consult your tax advisor, but if you are eligible for this, it is a very good deal!

Donor Advised Funds (DAFs) are tax-advantaged investment accounts used for charitable giving. You can fund a DAF with cash or other assets and take a tax deduction for doing so. Usually, people opt to contribute their appreciated investments so they don't have to face the tax consequences of selling it themselves. Once inside the donor-advised fund, your contributions continue to grow tax-free until you elect to issue a grant to the IRS-approved charity of your choice.

The beauty of donor-advised funds is they're available to anyone. Donoradvised funds are "designed to be a simple, turnkey way to execute your philanthropic wishes, whether you're giving \$500 or several million." You can give as much or as little (as long as it's at least \$50) as you want to one charity or dozens whenever you choose. Many charitable gift experts call donor-advised funds "flexible philanthropy."

# Young Adult Backpacking Trips 2.0!






